
## District Advocates: A Nationwide Effort

LPA's District Advocate program is dispatching trained volunteers to congressional offices around the United States. Through office visits, town hall meetings, and other public events, advocates are presenting ALPA's legislative pilot partisan priorities directly to their congressional representatives. This local grassroots action enhances ALPA's message and visibility while encouraging the development of stronger

relationships between ALPA pilots and their elected leaders.

## **Homeland Security Committee**

The House Homeland Security Committee provides oversight to federal agencies that protect U.S. borders from terrorism and other threats. The committee's jurisdiction includes the Transportation Security Administration and U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). ALPA works with members who serve on this committee on issues such as the Federal Flight Deck Officer program, CBP preclearance facilities, the integration of unmanned aircraft systems/unmanned aircraft vehicles into the U.S. national airspace system, secondary flight deck barriers, and passenger and crewmember airport screening procedures.

## **Transportation and Infrastructure Committee**

The Transportation and Infrastructure Committee has broad jurisdiction over all modes of transportation, including aviation. The committee provides oversight and drafts legislation affecting everything from aviation safety and infrastructure to labor and commercial issues. Members of Congress on the committee have influence over all FAA programs as well as the NTSB, the Essential Air Service program, and the National Mediation Board.
